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### **Also This Week:**

"On Tuesday, to learn about the rainforest biome, 5AM grew their own mini rainforest - a real one! We learnt about the 4 layers of the rainforest (emergent, canopy, understory and forest floor) whilst Mrs Alam modelled building a real tropical rainforest terrarium! We started by putting clay at the bottom of the jar to absorb water, then nutrient rich soil with activated carbon to keep the environment fresh, followed by more soil. We then added moss and different plants like real micro palm trees and fern! We also added animals that live on different layers e.g. the tapir lives on the forest floor and the toucan lives in the canopy layer. This was a really fun and exciting way to learn about the rainforests and we hope our rainforest ecosystem will thrive and survive!" 5AM





Year 5 have also been busy touring Tower Bridge and learning about a range of bridge structures as part of their design and technology unit.

"On 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2024, we went to the stunning Tower Bridge. It had electric powered engines which made the bridge open and close. We also build moulds of a new bridge crossing River Thames. It was spectacular." Bohan 5A
